One of Israel's leading legal mediators and arbitrators, with a unique expertise in resolving complex disputes in Israel, the US and Europe.

Served as an arbitrator and mediator in thousands of disputes in all areas of public and private law, many of the cases were referred to him by judges from all courts across Israel, including the Supreme Court.

Over 90% of the mediations he has handled ended with court-approved settlements. Most cases were of high media, legal and public profile.
